The trees are clearly stressed, and we've lost a few, but kudos to our well which has performed above and beyond.

The animals, knock on wood, are well. We had a false cancer scare with dog Shiner but he is now doing fine. Linda's new horse, Tio, a big & beautiful Appaloosa, moved in with us in April and it seems the donkey and goats have adjusted to the new leader of the pack. Linda has been riding more and hopes to start trail riding with Tio when the weather improves next year.

Linda retired her pet sitting business to devote more time to riding, habitat restoration, and wildlife rescue; remember last year Linda was certified by the National Wildlife Foundation as a Habitat Steward. Too bad that happened just as her business was taking off but the original rationale for the business was to help fund those other activities that she now had no time for. Catch 22.

Chad's activities were much the same as last year, volunteering with the AARP tax preparation program for elderly and low income folks, and with the Missing in America Project to locate and inter, with honors, the abandoned cremated remains of veterans. Barely recovering from that excitement, Linda then traveled to Savannah, GA, in Oct with long time friends Carolyn & Sue; such a beautiful and historic town.
